Chanukah

Concepts: freedom, miracles

Vocabulary: nes, gadol, haya, sham = a great miracle happened there; chanukiah; s'vivon (Israeli dreidels say "po/here")

Symbols/Custom: Maccabees = freedom fighters; lighting the menorah; playing dreidel; eating latkes, soufganiot, gelt

Props: menorah picture with flames, laminated pictures of the ways we celebrate Chanukah, Chanukah O Chanukah book, dreidels, candle stick puppets

Tips for Teaching This Unit:

 Decorate a felt board (or poster) with laminated pictures of the things we do to celebrate Chanukah, such as eating latkes, playing dreidel, etc. Sing Chanukah's Here, and as students give their suggestions which you zip into the song, add the pictures to the board. The children love seeing the picture develop with their ideas! (This is appropriate for 3's and older.) If the song feels too long, you can shorten it by singing the first verse (Chanukah's here, it's time to celebrate!) a few times, interspersed by putting their ideas on the board, rather than zipping those ideas into the song.

Chanukah's Here

2. We're so happy it's Chanukah! Sing **Hooray for Chanukah**! The verses can compare Chanukah to other holidays OR can be about the students' favorite things to do during Chanukah.

<u>Chorus:</u> Hip hip hooray (hooray!) for Chanukah! (3x) Hey hey, what do you say, hooray for Chanukah!

I like Passover/Sukkot, yes I do, And I really like Purim/Thanksgiving too, But the holiday I like best, Is Chanukah, yes, yes, yes! (chorus) I like latkes, yes I do, And I really like dreidels too, But the thing about Chanukah I like best, Is lighting candles, yes, yes, yes! (chorus)

Candle songs...

3. Ask the children if they can count to eight, and practice counting while alternately patting each leg. Explain that there are eight nights of Chanukah. Sing **Eight Little Candles**. This has been a highly engaging song for my students, ages 2-5, because of all the movement... fluttering fingers like candles, marching like Maccabees, spinning like dreidels and sizzling in their seats like latkes!

Eight Little Candles

<u>Chorus:</u> 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8! 1-2, 3-4, 5-6-7-8! (repeat)

8 little candles, shining, shining; 8 little candles shining bright! 8 little candles, shining, shining; Shining brightly for eight nights! (chorus)

8 little Maccabees, marching, marching; 8 little Maccabees, brave and strong! 8 little Maccabees, marching, marching; Marching as they sing this song! (chorus)

8 little dreidels, spinning, spinning; 8 little dreidels, spinning 'round! 8 little dreidels, spinning, spinning; Spinning dreidels all fall down! (chorus)

8 little latkes, sizzling, sizzling; 8 little latkes, good to eat! 8 little latkes, sizzling, sizzling; Sizzling latkes, such a treat! (chorus)

4. Another fun counting song is **How Many Candles!** This is a long song, but they enjoy shouting ONE-ONE-one-one at the appropriate time.

5. **Twinkle Twinkle Chanukah Lights** is very sweet! 2's and 3's love this because they know the 'real' song. Do hand motions with this or use craft-stick candles... it segues nicely to the blessings and candle-lighting.

6. It's also fun to 'light' a laminated Chanukiah with the 'flame' from their craft-stick candle while I sing **We Light The Chanukah Lights**.

7. **Eight Little Chanukah Lights** is a real crowd-pleaser for adults as well as children, who particularly enjoy the verse 'don't let anyone (blow) 'em out,' blowing instead of singing the word 'blow.' The craft-stick candle prop works well with this song too.

Latke songs...

8. Tell the story of the **Five Little Latkes** sizzling in the pan. I made felt-board prop with a picture of a frying pan and five smiling latkes, as well as an iBooks prop to show on an iPad, but it works just as well with just the hand motions. This is a HUGE favorite for preschool – Kindergarten!

9. Latke songs aren't complete without the wonderfully silly song – Yodelay-Do Potato (appropriate for 4's and older). Zip in the ways the children like to eat their latkes (with applesauce and sour cream, with their mothers, for breakfast, lunch and dinner, etc.) Show Doda Mollie's video of this song... it's precious!

- 10. Let the children practice spinning dreidels while we sing I Have a Little Dreidel. Include lots of silly verses with 3's and older (at end of this document). Pause after: "I made it out of <u>bread</u>;" children should respond by asking in an exaggerated way, "BREAD?!" Let them suggest what the dreidels can be made of, and then think quickly!
- 11. More fun dreidel songs are:

Turn Little Dreidel... spin like dreidels and fall down when the music stops by Chane Mlotek, English by Rachel Buchman

Turn around, turn around, spin little dreidele Turn around, turn around, spin little dreidele Faster and faster and win little dreidele Chanukah's here tonight!



1-2-3, 1-2-3, spin little dreidele...

S'-vi-von... spin around on sov, sov, sov; give a thumbs-up for 'tov'

S'-vi-von sov sov sov, Chanukah hu chag tov, Chanukah hu chag tov, s'-vi-von sov sov sov!

Chag simcha hu la-am, nes gadol ha-ya sham, Nes gadol ha-ya sham, chag simcha hu la-am!

S'vivon, turn and turn, while the lovely candles burn, What a wondrous holiday, watch us sing and dance and play!

Tell a story full of cheer, a great miracle happened there; It's a holiday of lights for eight days and eight nights!

More fun songs...

12. Other hit Chanukah songs for preschoolers include the following:

- a. In the Window... a capella with hand motions... I 'give out' imaginary crayons for drawing the window. This is great with 4's! I thought it worked fabulously to sing this soothing, meditative song right after the rowdy How Many Candles.
- b. Everyone Can Be a Maccabee... march with instruments.
- c. Chanukah O Chanukah... teach signs to 3's and 4's. I have a book with the lyrics, so it's fun to 'sing' the book to 2's and 3's.

- d. The Maccabees... they love the silly ending about how WE ate all the latkes!
- e. **Stand Up Like a Proud Maccabee...** stand up, spin around, shine your light and then sit down! Go faster with each repetition until everyone is giggling.
- f. A Great Miracle Happened There... I made a story book prop to accompany the song.
