
We raise our cups for the Kiddush, the blessing over the wine.

Now let us look at our seder table. We have flowers that remind us that Pesach is a spring festival, a seder plate with symbols of the Pesach story, and three pieces of matzah. We break the middle matzah in half and save one of the pieces for dessert.







We begin our seder by asking, "Why is this night different from all other nights?"



The Four Questions

Mah nishtana ha'lilah hazeh mikol haleilot? Why is this night different from all other nights?

Shebechol haleilot, anu ochlin hameitz u'matzah, halilah hazeh kulo matzah. On all other nights, we eat all kinds of bread; tonight, we only eat matzah.

Shebechol haleilot, anu ochlin she'ar yirakot, halilah hazeh maror. On all other nights, we eat all kinds of vegetables; tonight, we only eat bitter herbs.

Shebechol haleilot, ain anu matbilin afilu pa'am echat, halilah hazeh shetay feamim. On all other nights, we do not dip our food; tonight, we dip twice.

Shebechol haleilot anu ochlin bein yoshvin uvein misubin, halilah hazeh kulanu misubin. On all other nights, we eat sitting any way we want; tonight, we recline on a pillow.

It's time to fill our seder plates, seder plates, seder plates, It's time to fill our seder plates, it's time to celebrate!


