
(the saying of Kiddush)

Maggid


(the telling of the Hagadah)

(blessing and eating the matza)



'Eat' matzah; put two hands to lips

Maror

(eating the bitter herbs)



One hand waving at open mouth with "bitter" facial expression

Korekh

(eating a sandwich of matza and horse radish)



Make a sandwich, one hand on top of the other

Shulchan Orekh

(eating the festive meal)



Spread hands in front of you to indicate a table

Tzafun

(eating the afikomen)



Put hand over eyes and look around for the afikomen

Barekh

(reciting grace after meal)



Shape hands like a book

Hallel

(reciting Hallel, psalms of praise)



Hands up, waving

Nirtza

(our prayer that God accepts our service)



Arms in shape of an "X" and sweep down and out
