

Hands-On...

Megillah and More!

You'll Need:

1. Purple paper (9 sheets, 8.5x11")
2. 4 small plastic cups
3. Paper towel cardboard tube
4. Tape/Glue stick
5. Glitter paint pens
6. Gold ribbon
7. Purim clip-art

Tape the purple paper together to form a long sheet. This will be the background for the scroll.



Tape it to a cardboard tube and roll it so the colored paper has completely covered the tube.

Write the [Purim story](#) in an age-appropriate way for your students. Lay it out in MS Word horizontally on 6 sheets of paper with clip-art to illustrate the story. Print with a color printer, and glue the story pages to the purple scroll. Roll the scroll and tie with a gold ribbon.

Tape two cups together and decorate with glitter glue. Do the same for the other two cups. Place at the top and bottom of the scroll.

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More Ideas for Purim...

- Cut hamantaschen out of brown foam sheets and put a colored circle in the center as the jelly filling.
- Fill a trunk with a costume, grogger and Megillah.
- Print and laminate a picture of a castle; tape it to the back of a foam block; affix toothpicks to the back of the Purim characters. Use this when introducing the characters in the story, before 'reading' the Megillah.
- Decorate plastic eggs as each of the Purim characters. (idea by Jessi Teitter)
- Give out stick puppets that match the illustrations in the Megillah so that students can participate in the story-telling and subsequent songs.
