You'll Need:

- 1. Wooden crate or box with slats on the top
- 2. Fall leaf decoration
- 3. Clip-art of fruit and vegetables
- 4. Ribbon, cut in 6" strips
- 5. Hot-Glue qun
- 6. Velcro

Affix the fall leaf decoration to the top and sides of the box. Voila, instant sukkah!

Print clip-art (see next page); cut it out and laminate.

Affix a 6" length of ribbon to the back of the clip-art with a hot-glue gun. Staple a piece of Velcro to the end of the ribbon (soft side)

Affix Velcro (gripper side) along the top front edge of the sukkah. Put another strip of Velcro on the inside front edge of the next slat as well.

After Sukkot, remove decorations and use the crate as an Aron Kodesh for Simchat Torah!
