SUGGESTIONS FOR TEACHING THIS SONG...

- The song has two parts, which is helpful for teaching differentiation (the ability to distinguish between two different things, an important pre-literacy skill). There is a fast part (the chorus) and a slow part (the verses); there is a part where we clap (the chorus), and a part where we do hand motions (the verses).
- The chorus is very fast, so slow it down at the beginning.
- Clap hands on the chorus, putting arms up like a tree on the word 'tree.'
- Do hand motions for the verses for planting, growing, eating, saying, celebrating, thanking, hugging.
- I taught this successfully with 2's-PK.
